Gordon Daniel Morgan, age 88, passed away at his home on Tuesday, December 17, 2019. He was born on October 31, 1931, in Mayflower, Arkansas, to the late Roosevelt and Georgia (Matlock) Morgan. He is preceded in death by his Brother, Thomas Morgan; and son, Bryce Morgan.
